# Mental Health Providers

# Tailwinds 🚅



- Increasing demand for behavioral health care and a growing focus on mental health parity
- Lack of regulation of residential wilderness programs
- Newly authorized Medicare coverage for services rendered by marriage and family therapists and mental health counselors [CAA23]
- Upcoming 50% Medicare payment increases for crisis psychotherapy services furnished in mobile units and other specific settings starting in 2024 [CAA23]
- Elimination of the requirement for a "X-waiver" prior to prescribing buprenorphine for opioid use disorder [CAA23]

- Operational difficulties of integrating with the traditional health care system
- Inadequate reimbursement for residential treatment centers due to the lack of codes that sufficiently distinguish between behavioral, mental health, and substance abuse treatment

## Tailwinds 🚅



- Extension of several ground ambulance service payment add-ons through CY 2024, including a 3% increase for trips originating in rural areas, a 2% increase in urban areas, and a "super rural" add-on of 22.6% in the "lowest population density" areas [CAA23]
- Upcoming policy recommendations expected from the Ground Ambulance and Patient Billing Advisory Committee, which will address balance billing by ground ambulances as part of the No Surprises Act

### Tailwinds 🚓

Headwinds

- 2-year extension of COVID-related Medicare telehealth flexibilities to allow audio-only communications, geographic, originating site, and many other flexibilities to continue [CAA23]
- 2-year extension to continue allowing individuals with healthcare coverage under a Health Savings Account-eligible High Deductible Health Plan to access telehealth services without first satisfying their deductible [CAA23]
- Termination and expiration of state-level telehealth COVID-related flexibilities by professional boards, state insurance agencies, and Medicaid agencies
- Increasingly aggressive enforcement against telehealth providers on the federal and state level, particularly with regards to prescribing
- Rapidly evolving state-level restrictions on reproductive health services delivered through telehealth due to the *Dobbs* decision













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
