A member of the adjunct faculty at American University Washington College of Law's Health Law and Policy Institute, Mr. Christ also routinely speaks and writes on matters concerning health care fraud and abuse and electronic discovery. He is a coauthor of *Legal Issues in Health Care Fraud and Abuse: Navigating the Uncertainties, 4th ed.*, published by the American Health Lawyers Association in June 2012. While attending the University of Maryland School of Law, he served as the Managing Editor of the *Journal of Health Law and Policy* and as a research assistant for the Center for Health and Homeland Security. He completed the University of Maryland School of Law concentration in Health Law.

His prior experience also includes performing internal audits for a government contractor and acting as a liaison to federal auditors.
